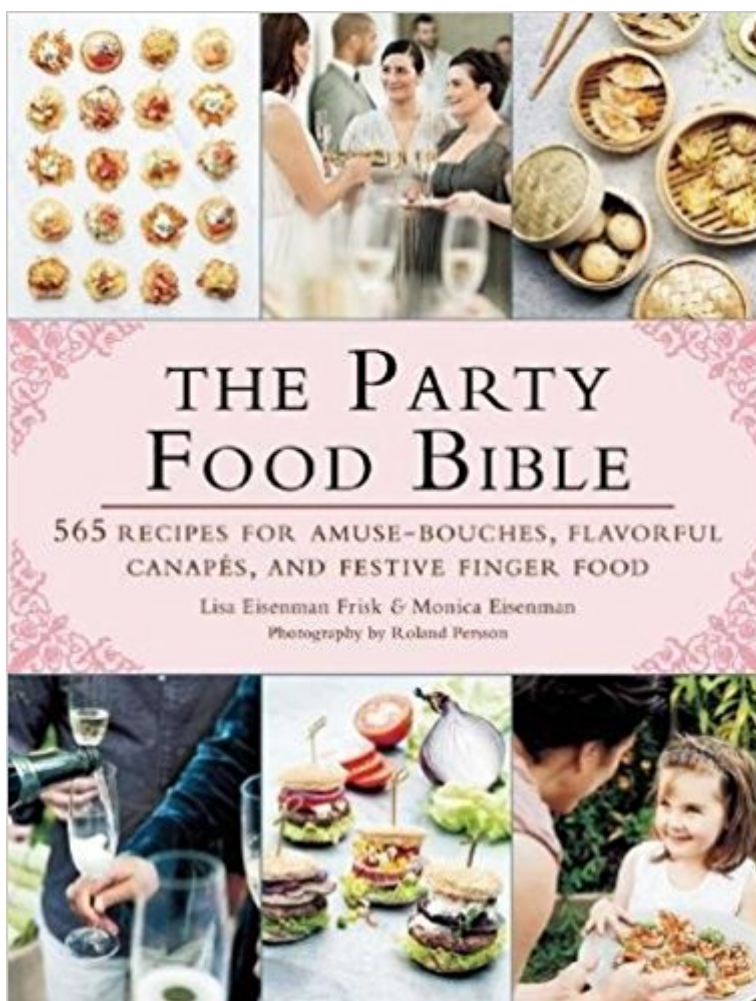

Great ideas for "amuse-gueules". I made a few recipes for a baby shower and got compliments: Gougere (cheese pate-a-choux), mini quiches, mushroom and cognac vol-au-vent, and parmesan wheels were all successful. It inspired me to try my hand at eclairs as it uses the same base as the pate-a-choux dough given in the recipe book. I did have a look at youtube to get more comfortable with how to make them. The kindle version is not easy to use though, and I am sure the book is much better.

While this book has a lot of interesting recipes, potential purchasers should be forewarned that this book suffers from some of the worst editing that I have ever seen from what purports to be a publishing house. It makes me wonder if an editor even looked at the manuscript. Some of the errors I found in the first chapter included not specifying the size of the baking pan to use for salmon terrine recipe. In the salmon roll up recipe the instruction say to overlap the "roast bee" in a rectangle--there's no roast beef in the salmon recipe. Also, what size should the rectangle be. For the omelet roll ups, they don't specify the size of baking sheet to use--half sheet or cookie sheet.

Whenever a recipe calls for ingredients to be sautéed in a pan, and temperature is never given--should it be cooked over medium heat or some other temperature. After a while I got tired of counting the errors in it. If the publisher is going to publish more cookbooks, they should really invest in a copy of the book "Recipes Into Type" and a professional cookbook editor.

Ok book, my biggest complaint is on the kindle the pictures are too small. There are labels as to which appetizer is what on the picture itself, rather than in the captions. With the picture so small, even when you click on it to enlarge it, you are unable to read the names. I bet it worked well in the hardcover. The tiny pictures make them pretty much useless.

This book has many fun, classic recipes with tips for making the dishes ahead of time. Not a lot of photos, which is okay for me.

Really gorgeous book to read and review. I definitely will use it for my next party Recommend this to intermediate to advanced cooks as most recipes are a bit involved for an inexperienced cook
