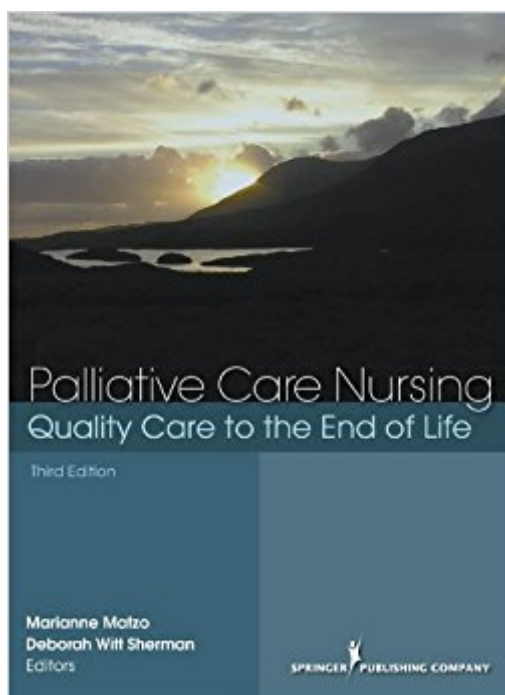

I agree with the other reviewers--there are errors on nearly every page, some multiple times. I was shocked to be reading an actual published book, by a well-known publishing company, with this many typos. What's more, the copyright information in the front doesn't even have the copyright symbol. The absolute worst error is in figure 5.1, at the bottom of the figure. The heading reads "THE RAPIES". Seriously?

This text is horrible. The print quality is very cheap - it is basically printed on copy paper. The text has glaring grammar errors and missing words. Entire paragraphs are reprinted. Words are misspelled or simply omitted. The absolute worst textbook editing I have ever seen. It's as if no one ever read the thing. There are errors on nearly every page. Ridiculous.
