

In their quest to learn more about magic, India and Matt begin investigating the apothecary and the newspaper reporter. It is not long until there is a murder and the weapon was magical. The book has more magic, more conspiracy theories, more learning about other types of magic, more looking for Chronos, more matchmaking and more romantic tension.
