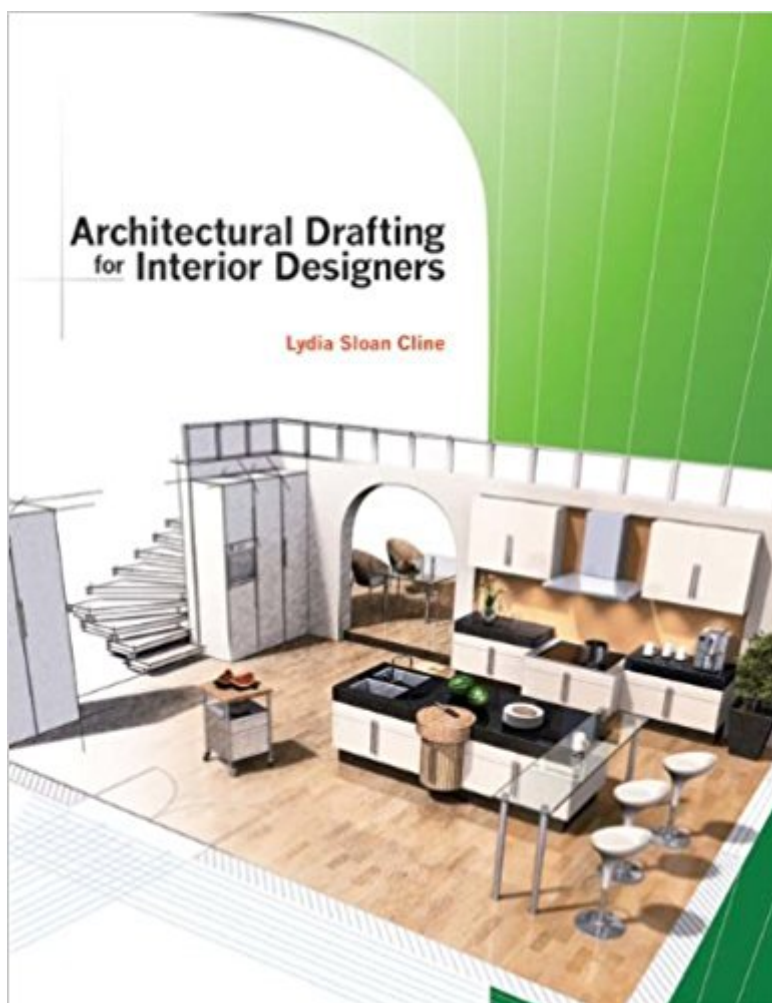

She has worked as an architect for the US Army where she designed maintenance/repair and minor construction projects for Army Installations in Germany and the US. She also worked as a designer helping to design hospitals for the Hospital Corporation of America and the Veterans Administration. She is the author of *Today's Military Wife*, which has been in print for fourteen years and is currently in its fifth edition.

This book is very informative for first time drafters. It focuses, of course, on interiors rather than exteriors, but it is comprehensive in terms of tool use and the basic skills needed. One important thing to keep in mind (that I didn't realize, but I got lucky!) is that if you buy this book for a CLASS, you probably don't want to buy a used one off any old website. There are worksheets in the back of the book that coordinate with lessons throughout. Your professor may not use them, but mine does and I am glad that mine were all still intact. Make sure you ask your seller if the worksheets are all still there!

This was a required text for a drafting class. The teacher urged us to buy and keep this text instead of renting or reselling because of all the reference information it contains. Since the class I have used this book many times to double check clearances and standard layouts. It is a great intro for drafting and a useful reference for projects.
