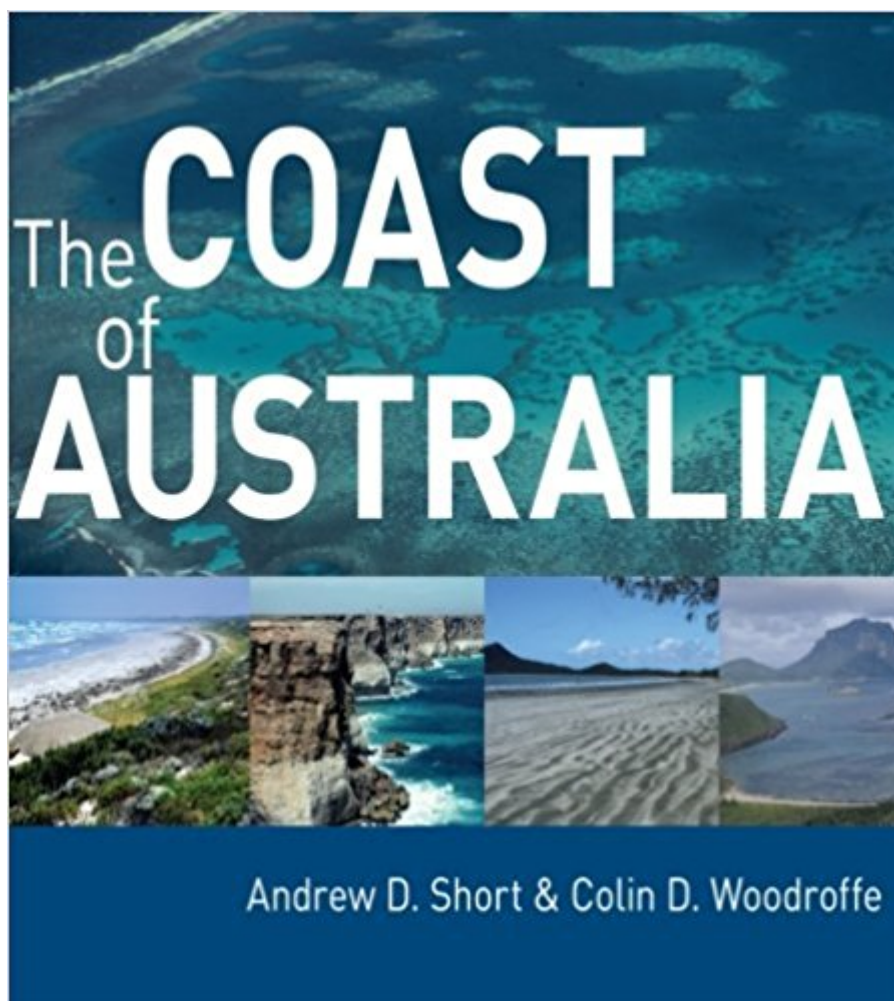


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# The Coast Of Australia

You might think from the title and cover photo that this is a typical coffee-table travelogue book. Big, and stuffed with many colour photos of Australian beaches. Well to be sure, there are indeed numerous pretty shots of the coastline. But the book is a more serious technical study of the coast. It can be best suited for the geography, geology or oceanography student. The discussion looks at the structures of the beaches and of the nearby underwater shelves. So for example if you are a student or just a beachgoer, the book can be a fascinating and deeper analysis of what makes a beach. The discussion includes topics like why a beach often has a surf zone, and how sand is transported by waves and how a beach can be eroded. You can appreciate that every beach is a dynamic region, where the actions of change are more obvious than in the wind erosion of land structures. The book points out that Australian beaches are dominated by the transverse bar and rip type. Think of the beaches that you have swam in; perhaps some were too like this? The coverage is extensive. I have never seen a book like this, with its national comprehensive understanding of all of Australia's beaches.

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
