

Clemens A. Kathman, better known as "Clem" survived The Great Depression only to have his plans interrupted by Hitler, Mussolini, and Tojo. He spent more than three years as a prisoner of war before being liberated in September 1945. After being discharged, he resumed working in the newspaper field, retiring in 1981. This is his first book. --This text refers to the Paperback edition.

This book was wonderful. It is a true story of a POW and was recommended by someone who also served in the South Pacific during WW II. There is not a lot of gory details; we all know how life was for captured military men. The story is uplifting since Clem never lost hope of being rescued despite

his situation. Easy read.
