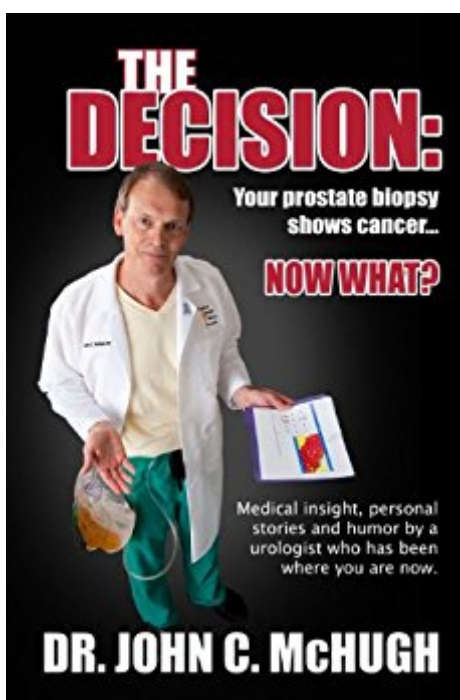

liked it, but he enjoyed its simplicity. A child could read and understand this book. By all means, every man and "man-owner" should read everything on prostate cancer. If a breezy manner gets it for you, then this is a fine book. I prefer the "gold standard" book, by Dr. Patrick Walsh of Johns Hopkins. It's more technical, but that is what is needed, in my opinion. I didn't care for the author's "I'm so great, funny and RELIGIOUS, I impress even myself" attitude. He didn't impress me at all, in this regard.. It's not up to an MD to tout his own religious beliefs in this arena. (Nor is it up to a surgeon to drag his personal resentment of his own father into the consultation room.) Perhaps it's just me. But in answer to anyone who questions the advisability of surgery in the face of prostate cancer, get over it. Dr. McHugh made the right choice in having surgery and not taking chances. Some people say, "a surgeon is ALWAYS going to recommend surgery." The author isn't going to profit from all the men in the world who have surgery! He's trying to save lives with this book. He's being selfless. Frightened men who worry about incontinence and want an alternative to surgery are fooling themselves. Any responsible MD is going to opt for surgery when it is needed. They know how insidious this disease is. Anyone who has watched a man die from prostate cancer knows that the ultimate pre-emptive strike is surgery when needed, and any follow-up the surgeon may recommend. Sure, read this book. The author wants to help everyone he can reach. If you want ALL the details, read this book and Dr. Walsh's book together. But guys, don't be afraid of the small stuff. Choose life--yours. My best to all of you.

This is one among many books helpful when you get a prostate cancer diagnosis. After reading several books and speaking to many doctors we were able to make an informed decision. Since treatment procedures change so quickly, it's important to read newly published books (sort 's search results by publication date). And, in our experience, the more doctors we spoke with the more options and information we were able to gather. Larger hospitals in nearby cities offered options we had not heard elsewhere, were competitively priced, and covered by our insurance in all the same ways.

I would recommend this book to anyone who has been diagnosed with prostate cancer or has a family history. Physicians typically do not have the time or ability to explain everything to us, the patient, as we do not have all the questions that need to be asked. Most Men are faced with an somewhat fast and overwhelming situation, once diagnosed. This book really assisted me in making an "Informed" decision. I had planned on obtaining a second opinion from another Urologist but after reading the book realized that the second opinion should be with an radiation/oncologist. and again,

after reading this book I attended my appointment well informed and ready to ask the right questions. By the end of my consultation with the oncologist we had both agreed that surgery was the answer for me and not radiation. I read this truly excellent book about 10 months ago, but didn't feel compelled to review it until another reviewer was critical of its production values. Though the book's exterior and art production are less than perfect, its invaluable content makes all such considerations pale. This is a priceless, non-proselytizing, first-person revelation of what a practicing urologist did after he received word that his prostate biopsy was positive. What more could any individual in a similar predicament ask? Simply put, this book provides an illuminating road map for any man faced with making the often life-changing decisions required when one is battling prostate cancer. Along with Dr. McHugh's book, I would also suggest to all prostate cancer patients the individual books by Doctors Walsh, Scardino, Katz, and Chodak. Ideally, one should digest all these volumes before any firm decision is reached. I would also urge avoidance of the massively misleading internet -- at least until these books are well understood, though that, I realize, is probably asking too much. And, most of all, each man must take sufficient time to knowledgeably make his own right decision; second chances are rare.
