

I recommend this book, but read with an open mind and an understanding that this is one author's compilation and interpretation. It is also an easy and digestible read for those of you who are not avid readers *Update* as I read this I continue to find typographical errors, even different spellings of the same name on the same page. makes me wonder how reliable the data is.

Compiling 50 events that make human history is a huge task. The author tackles it well, but every event is described very briefly, just 1-2 pages on each one. These are types of events that you can write a whole book on each and every one so it is kind of underwhelming to crunch it down to a few facts. Besides that, it is entertaining to read, I read it in one sitting. If you need a brief reminder on humanity, this book is good enough for a couple of hours.
