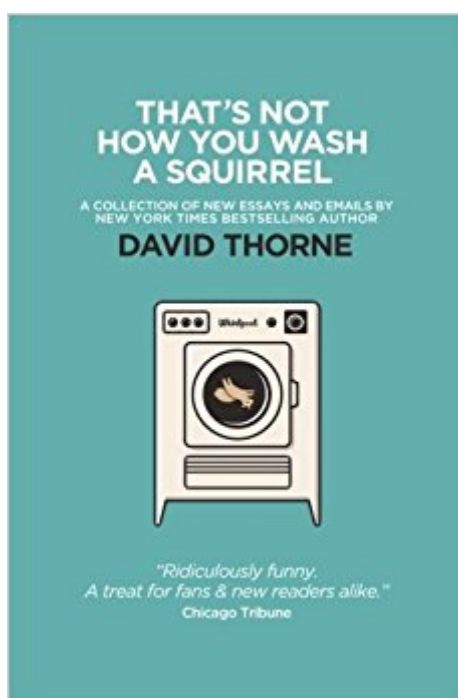


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That's Not How You Wash A Squirrel: A Collection Of New Essays And Emails

The back cover also quotes a scene involving said squirrel and a washing machine - which is also depicted on the book cover, and yet my version does not contain this fundamental plot event. More personal than his previous books but still every bit as funny and witty. Wit/smarty pans? Witty Pants. And his wife, who is entertaining as well in her contributions to this book). His chapters on his

son being all grown up hit a nerve because I remember reading his blog post about funny things his young son would say when it first came out. It's a short read, great for a 5 hour flight because you won't be able to put it down. A warning though, reading this might inspire a sense of humour and willingness to point out the inanity of rules and regulations that airline officials might not agree with.

Along with all his previous books this is laugh out loud with tears rolling down your face hilarious , the only problem with David thorne books is that there's not a lot more of them.

I bought this one because his first two books were so funny. This one only has a few emails. 1 was mildly amusing. The rest of the book was a little depressing. He wrote about his son moving away to live with his mom, reuniting with his dad only to grow apart, and having someone bleed out in his arms after a car wreck.

I cannot put in to words how much I enjoy David Thorne's writing. If you have read political satire and enjoy it...well, you're nuts. Read this instead. Much more enjoyable.

This is classic David Thorne. Just like his first book there are some highs and lows, but mostly highs! Funny book.

Please note that while the blurb states "over two hundred pages of brand new, never before seen essays and emails", the actual page count is a worrying 161. Fortunately, the quality of the material more than makes up for the missing 40+ pages - Thorne is on top form with a fine selection of his wonderfully wandering stories and entertainingly eviscerating emails.
