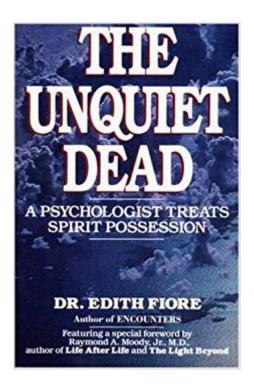

Dr. Edith Fiore received her Ph.D. in psychology from the University of Miami. She moved to and practiced in California for more than thirty years, first with a general clinical practice and then from 1975 on as a hypnotherapist. She retired in 1997 and now lives in Florida. Dr. Fiore has lectured nationally and internationally and has trained more than two thousand professionals in her innovative techniques. She wrote three books on aspects of her work as a hypnotherapist.

My brother was a paranoid schizophrenic and used street drugs to block the voices. I know that he was full of spirits which were running him. I had a woman who specialized in "The Reconnection" by Dr. Eric Pearl work with my brother for 1-1/2 years right up to his death from cancer, and my brother became a changed, wonderful man. These processes work. This was before I knew about The Unquiet Dead. Her process works, too!

Wonderful book to understand the importance of the invisible impact of souls that do not keep their journey to the light after death, but that stays in our world. The impact can be very serious and this is much more common than we think. It also teaches how to help those souls and the depossession of the persons affected by this.

Edith Fiore writes a very comprehensive book about another side of mental illness that most people fail to see or realize that there's more to it that meets the eye. I'm a certified hypnotist who specializes in past life regression work with many of my clients and occasionally I've come across spirits in my clients that create problems for them. This book has given me a valuable insight as to why these spirits are in these clients and how to help my clients to release them. Many people who are suicidal are unaware that their thoughts of suicide are probably triggered by spirits. The same goes for alcoholism and drug addiction as well as any other behaviors that are self-destructive. If I'm in question about a certain behavior in someone, I give this book to them in hopes they will read it. Every mental health professional should read this book plus anyone else who is doing some soul searching and wants to explore all aspects that are the cause of certain human behaviors for this book will change the way they look at life.
