

Fern Marshall Bradley, a lifelong organic gardener, is also an editor and writer based in eastern Pennsylvania. A former book editor for Rodale, Inc., Fern's editing credits include Rodale's All-New Encyclopedia of Organic Gardening, Rodale's Garden Answers, and Gardening with Perennials. She has a master's degree in horticulture from Rutgers University and has managed a market garden on an organic farm in New Jersey.

I spent some time taking several books out of the library and found this to be one of two that has been the most helpful. It is chock full of ideas that are easy to execute and have proven effective. I have bought very little in the way of commercially made feeders, but have quite easily gotten a feeding station that offers four basic seeds (black sunflower, white millet, niger thistle and suet). This book also showed me how to make a quick and effective bird bath that featuring a drip that really draws in the birds in during the warmer weather. The other book that has been a big help is "Wild about Birds" by Carrol L. Henderson. I also found that "The Cornell Feeder Watcher's Guide to Bird Feeding" by Jack Griggs and Margaret A. Barker gave me the courage to explore the more creative ideas of home-made bird feeders. It has a section that features folks talking about their Bird Feeding Stations. Some of them were quite eccentric --- really great stuff! hope to venture into landscaping for the birds this summer. I'm confident "Projects for the Birder's Garden" will be great for this too, but I will also be looking at Stephen Kress' "The Audubon Society Guide to Attracting Birds: Creating Natural Habitats for Properties Large and Small" for more information on aspects of gardening for birds.

This book is a joy, with projects for everyone from the most skillful handyman to the 5 year old who loves birds. The book walks you through the projects, as well as the why for it. It groups them is sections of similar projects, and in some cases, of skill. It will help you turn your yard into the bird haven you've always wanted.

This book will delight the Do-It-Yourself types who would rather put something together and attract birds to their backyards than to merely observe them in the wild. It's a sturdy, glossy trade

paperback with detailed line-drawings, tables, side-bars, and step-by-step project sheets. It starts with a section of fast-and-easy projects for beginners to get your feet wet with the easiest of the various types of woodworking, cooking, and gardening projects you can do to attract birds. Later chapters go into detail on each of the specialties (woodworking, cooking, gardening) so that you can either do it all or just focus on the chapters that address your talents. The book also includes a Projects-at-a-Glance index so you can look up things to do involving Nesting, Water, Landscaping, et cetera. Highly recommended. Longer review at Ornate Bird Garden-dot-com.

This book is SO much more than a collection of projects for attracting birds. It is full of very detailed information about backyard birds: what bird eats what food, what type of feeder attracts what bird, nesting patterns, behavioral characteristics and virtually every other fact you would want to know to maximize your bird watching experience. I like this book so much I've given it as a gift. It's a reference you will keep coming back to and the projects (many of which can save the thrifty birdwatcher a lot of money) are fun and rewarding.

This book has a wealth of information for planning bird gardens. It tells what types of food, plants, trees, houses and baths will attract certain types of birds. I also appreciated some of the suggestions for keeping away unwanted visitors. There are some basic designs for bird houses included, but more important is the lists telling the inside dimensions, hole size and height, and placement of houses to attract specific birds. There are "recipes" for bird foods to attract certain the birds you want, including humming birds. There is also a section about butterflies.

I have never seen a book with so many easy-to-try ideas in one place. I flagged so many pages, I ran out of sticky-note flags! Most of the ideas do not require sawing or drilling, although those types of projects are also included for the more adventurous bird lover. I purchased this book for a friend because I was so pleased with it.
