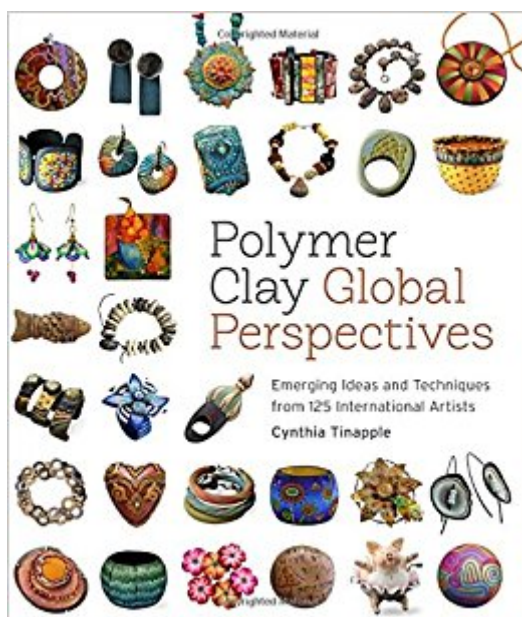

She has worked as a polymer clay artist since the late 1980s, collaborating with her

husband, woodworker Blair Davis, to embellish his turned bowls and other objects with polymer clay inlay designs.

This book has beautiful work displayed from artists all around the world. I was very disappointed that very little technical knowledge was shared. You're not able to expand the pictures, only the text which is ironic since there's not enough technique sharing. If the book says polymer clay ideas from artists around the world, the least it would allow the reader the ability to zoom in and admire their work better. I don't recommend this book if you're interested in extending your knowledge with polymer clay. It's mostly the artist biography how each were influenced to work with polymer clay.

I had received my book on Wednesday and could not wait to look through it. I loved the personal side of the artists. The techniques were a bonus. Cynthia a nice job on giving us a personal side of the artist and the pictures of the work spaces were great! I took this to my guild meeting yesterday and everyone who looked at it said they were going to get it, or had ordered it and was anxiously waiting for it to arrive.

When a new polymer clay book arrives my process is to browse the pictures first then explore the articles. I rarely read the intro and basic information but this book caught me by surprise and I find myself reading every story word for word and was especially fascinated by the "Accessing Your Work" section. I am an experienced polymer artist and was surprised to learn so many new

techniques. Eva Haskova's article sent me running to the studio to create something with the wonderful color blends she used for her "Colorful Rays Spiral Pendant." To see the different ways a hanger can be inserted, a surface can be textured and painted and a new spin on making hollow beads excites me and even though I may not want to create a piece the way the artist did I have learned from their creative journey. Thanks so much for bringing this book to life Cynthia.
