


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Miniature Projects With Polymer Clay

Many of the models have moveable parts such as a winding handle on a miniature gramophone, a balancing set of dolls house scales and a tiny globe that spins. She specialises in polymer clay, metal clay, jewellery making and miniatures. She also writes fiction and has published two musicals for children. After a childhood spent in the Far East, Middle East and Africa, Sue studied at art college and university in Great Britain. She first worked as an archaeological illustrator before turning to a career as a writer, designer and teacher. She has taught polymer clay and metal clay workshops all over the world as well as on cruise ships. She is a qualified Art Clay Senior Instructor and has taken Master classes in the subject in Japan. She founded the British Polymer Clay Guild in 1997 and Art Clay World UK Guild in 2005. She is an accomplished artist working in

oils and watercolour and teaches regular art classes. Sue is married with two daughters and lives in rural Suffolk, England, UK. She is a keen musician and plays the violin, viola and piano accordion. She also enjoys sailing, swimming - and mountain hiking with her sketchbook in hand.

Just what we $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{A}$ \hat{A}^{TM} ve come to expect from Sue Heaser. My beef is with the kindle format altogether. The text for each project is spread a few sentences at a time over many more pages than is efficient for reading. It $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{A}$ \hat{A}^{TM} s even worse to have to page through many pages if you want to refer back to an earlier part of the description. I even tried to highlight and copy the text into another program so that I could print it out in a more durable, easy-to-read-at-a-glance format, but apparently the many, many tiny text blocks are in a graphics format instead of real text. BTW, the advertised feature that it remembers the place where you stopped reading just doesn $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{A}$ $\hat{A}^{TM}t$ work. It $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{A}$ $\hat{A}^{TM}s$ really irritating to have to page through all those mostly empty pages AGAIN just to find where you left off, and because the numbers on the pages don $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{A}$ $\hat{A}^{TM}t$ seem to be synchronized with the pdf page numbers, searching for the page number doesn $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{A}$ $\hat{A}^{TM}t$ work well, either. Bottom line: wait for the published book that you can hold in your hands and lay flat on your work table. I $\tilde{A}\phi\hat{A}$ $\hat{A}^{TM}d$ deserve 5 stars.
