We Have Lost the Coffee is an amusing and entertaining journey through the streets of London. Sadly, I am only about 60% through, though that is more a reflection on me than the writer. Mr. Matthews writes in a fast-paced, delightful manner that keeps the reader going to discover the answer to the mysteries. Will Howie find the missing coffee? Will Britt catch her woman? Are these things related? I truly enjoy Howie and Britt's relationship - it feels very real to me in that they're not constantly in each others pockets and they share an easy comradery. However, I did give the story 4 stars because of a technicality. I'm not fond of the random occurrences of 2nd person throughout the story. I do plan to update my review once I've completed the story, and I also hope to read the other two books in the "Lost" series. Mr. Matthews is well-worth the read.

Another entertainingly funny novel by Paul Mathews. The story is set in the future in the UK, which is no longer a kingdom or queendom, but a republic and instead of hordes of legendary English tea drinkers the citizens are now addicted to coffee, Earl Grey being the only acceptable tea. As the title tells us, there is no more coffee in Britain. All coffee producing countries are boycotting Britain. The hero, Howie Pond, spokesperson for the President, is once again in the spy game, while his reporter wife, Britt, chases down a royal who has illegally entered Britain. A happy read.
